




#### **PATIENCE**

# YOUR MOST ATTRACTIVE QUALITY "PATIENCE IS A VIRTUE"

As a child in a worship service said, "Patience means you have to wait a lot" Yet somehow God assures us that patience is a fruit of His Spirit. He intends for patience to grow within us as the Holy Spirit shapes our hearts. God is patient and he desires for His children to be patient too.

The scriptures define three kinds of patience: end-time patience, social patience, and personal patience (or endurance).

END-TIME PATIENCE. Believers wait for the Lord. We wait for the coming of the Lord. We wait for the return of Jesus. We wait for our souls to be reunited with Jesus forever. We wait for justice to be brought upon the evils of this world. We wait. This is end-time patience.

Life with God is eternal. Knowing that fact makes patience much easier to grasp and possess. We do not lose heart when things do not work out as we hoped, because we know there is coming a day when the purpose of God will prevail. Right will be made right and evil will be no more. This is worth waiting for.

SOCIAL PATIENCE means patience with other people, with the very real people in our life, right here and right now. "Clothe yourselves with..patience. Bear with one another". Just as God is patient with us and our failures, so too does He desire that we will be patient with our difficult neighbors, our rebellious child, or our opinionated coworkers, in our struggle to live and be together. Bearing with one another when shortcomings and failures are apparent – that is social justice.

PERSONAL PATIENCE. The toughest part of patience, but also the most rewarding part.

The work of the Spirit makes Himself known to us as we learn to experience the hand of God in our suffering rather than despite our suffering. God can and does grow our patience by using the suffering in our life to draw us closer to Him. God does not cause us suffering, but He can use it to grow us. When we can endure personal suffering and still look God in the eye with a heart full of thanksgiving and joy, that is personal endurance and patience generated only by the Holy Spirit.

In the end, the Spirit draws us closer to God. The further we walk with God, the more we learn to stay the course and trust Him to provide. The more we grow in the spirit, the more patience we have, for we slowly grow to understand that God really is in control.

God is patient. And God will grow patience in us.

#### SYCAMORE FOOD PANTRY

St. Peter's is no longer gathering food donations for the pantry, but monetary donations are always welcome. Quarterly donation checks are sent from the Christian Outreach Committee to the Sycamore Food Pantry, indicating our desire to have food purchased through the Food Bank to guarantee the most value for our donated funds. A check for \$550, \$50 from parishioners and \$450 from the Outreach Committee, was sent in December. # St. Peter's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting November 16, 2023 Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by the Senior Warden.

The vestry and clergy read the opening prayer. Present: Varsie Geisler, John Vain, Stefanie Hill, Lynne Roberts, Jenny Sidmore, Cindy Vain, Brian Duffy,

Fr Mark Geisler, Pat Klein Approval of Agenda: Approved with 3

additions: Bylaws update, convention, and committee reports

Approval of October Minutes: Approved with the spelling correction to Varsie Geisler's name.

Treasurer's Report: Pledges down for October \$5231. YTD pledges are over \$11,000. Com Ed expenses are over

budget, NICOR expenses are under budget. John Vain gave a detailed report on the finance committee meeting with a review of trust funds.

Motion made and approved to withdraw 5% from Trust funds for 2024 and utilize 4% for budget needs. 1% then returned to trust funds.

Senior Warden's Report: Supply priests were used for two Sunday services. The remaining 2023 Sunday Services were

reviewed. Eucharist will be in Waterman Hall before St. Nicholas dinner on December 8. ECW lunch with the DeKalb ECW group was delightful. More gatherings were suggested. We are doing a good job keeping projects moving.

Junior Warden's Report: Gripper strips have been purchased and will be put on all the wooden steps.

Sacristy steps are on the schedule for repair/replacement next spring. Security cameras will

be installed in the next 2 weeks. A concern with a lack of attention to locked doors was discussed as the Waterman Hall doors were both found to be unlocked on Monday morning.

**Committee Reports:** 

Outreach: 26 shoe boxes are on their way to end recipients. After the holidays a video will be available to see just how the boxes are put together using a child's wish list.

Angel gift tree tags: Salvation Army is not sending information. Alternative: Hope Haven asking for family help. 2 families using Outreach funds. We will continue to give gifts from St. Nicholas dinner

to the Salvation Army. Hope Haven: dinner is the day before Thanksgiving. Rosati's will cater much of the meal and deliver it to Hope Haven.

We will send fruit and pie earlier that day. Outreach will cover the cost of the meal. Caregivers: A meeting will be held to review the current list of shut-ins.

#### **Old Business**

"All Are Welcome Here" discussion. 2 schools of thought: we are already a welcoming church. A small sign noting that would be ok. A rainbow could cause trouble for people who are opposed

to displays of LGBTQ support. Church members could be hurt. We are children of God and live a Christian faith.

Our Mission statement says that we are inclusive. Suggestion: wording added to our new church sign:

ALL are welcome. Vestry approved and Anita will work with Banner Up.

- Clean-up and minor repairs/upkeep rectory. No report.
- Storage closet for Waterman Hall: \$4000 estimate with end-of-January completion
- Talk with Pam Brown (permanent custodian position) Varsie will meet with her.
- Special Events list for newcomers: vestry members are to put together lists to share at the Dec. mtg.

#### **New Business**

- Ideas for new vestry members and new vestry clerk are needed in January 2024. The December Morningstar will ask for names and the January Morningstar will list candidates.
- Kitchen electrical wiring. A new breaker is needed. Finney's will be contacted.
- Bylaws update. John will send the bylaws file to Varsie and Stefanie for updating.
- Sign for Hallway approved to hang above the service window.
- Convention: have resolutions been reviewed? Support of Palestine is on the resolution. Adjournment: Motion made by Stefanie Hill with a second from Jenny Sidmore. Motion carried.
